Board of Management update:

Veteran Views

We want to keep the TVVSC in everyone's mind as it is a place that Veterans can call with queries on Advocacy and Welfare. It is a helpful place to connect with a person who can support queries with claims to DVA or indeed any matters to do with welfare.

The Tamar Valley Veteran Support Centre is based in the Sub-Branch at 44 Macquarie Street and we encourage individuals and families to enquire or seek information about claims, benefits, DVA queries, and other agencies. Sometimes there are changes that occur within the DVA that not everyone hears about, so queries can be answered if anyone is in doubt or have been putting off doing something because they are unsure of what to do for their situation. This service is offered to the community of the North East including Beaconsfield, Lilydale, Scottsdale, Exeter, Bridport and George Town and encompasses rural areas in between. Please make contact with Greg Rush Pensions and Advocacy officer at the Sub Branch. Greg works both at the TVVSC at 44 Macquarie Street George Town on Tuesday as well as Launceston on Thursday.
