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Board of Management update:

The last Board of Management was held on July 8th there was much discussed including the following.

State Congress has been deferred until 19th September. Further details as we get closer to the date.

Board Member and Protocols officer, Brian Bull, has been looking at a review of our documentation of a simple code of dress, in line with other organisations. A motion was passed that a code of acceptable neat tidy dress be documented as Standard Operating Procedure. That motion was carried.

The Farmer's Market looks like starting again in September. The council have handed this event over to the RSL to run. There will be a book at the front desk for any bookings for stalls, once health guidelines to permit such gatherings are given. Numbers in our premises are still restricted to area space.

We have limited storage space at the Sub Branch, so President Vince Davis is seeking to find storage possibilities in the community. He is working with council to move this forward.

With the closure of Bank of Heritage Isle in the North, the Sub-Branch have changed business dealings to Bendigo Bank. This change has happened with no major issues. We also now have Eftpos facility options available for membership, merchandise sales, and cashless at Bar during happy hour. To cover costs for this facility we do have to make a small convenience charge of 20c per transaction to cover the fee charged. This facility is not for cash out actions. If you are coming along to Happy Hour, we advise having some cash along with you, especially if you are not in the habit of using cards for transactions.

George Town Remembers:

Vietnam Veterans Day is commemorated on 18 August every year. The day was originally known as Long Tan Day, chosen to commemorate the men of D Company, 6RAR who fought in the battle of Long Tan in 1966. On that day, 108 Australian and New Zealand soldiers fought a pitched battle against over 2,000 North Vietnamese and Viet Cong troops in a rubber plantation not far from the small village of Long Tan. The Australians prevailed, but only after fighting in torrential rain for four hours.

We take this opportunity to remind the community that we, along with other towns in the North, share the responsibility for holding a service for Vietnam Veterans, their families and others. This year there

will be service held in the Northern Midlands RSL as well as a service organized through the Launceston Vietnam Veterans Association to be held in Launceston. We usually run 2 shifts at each event, 10people. Barry is organizing a short information session to assist everyone to understand the simple but safe processes needed.
