AGM and Board of Management Update:

The AGM was held on the 23rd August with forty members attending along with invited guests, State VP, Geoff Leitch and his wife BJ and GT Council General Manager, Shane Power. We appreciate everyone's involvement and interest in how the RSL Sub Branch is going and for participation in voting new members to the Board of Management.

The meeting agenda was followed and included the President's, Treasurer's and Auditors reports and opportunity to raise business about the matters tabled. All reports were accepted. A new Motion was put forward by the President, Vince Davis, with the following Rational:

Quote 'Subject to the opportunity of maintaining equality in the senior management position and the increase in Affiliate membership, I believe that the time has come to have the substantive position of Vice President (Affiliate). This would allow a representation for both Service and Affiliate members within the Executive.' Unquote. The motion was carried.

Welfare Report: It was reported that the War Widows morning teas (now called Ladies morning tea) were deferred during COVID-19.

The proposed and budgeted Bus Trips and Movie nights are planned to start depending on COVID 19 restrictions. Welfare and Pension Advocates are still attending to member's needs as they arise, with some hospital visits being made during this year. The COVID Pandemic found opening hours drop off and we are back to Summer opening hours whilst continuing to follow recommended restrictions and Health guidelines.

Some Nominations for new office bearers were listed on the agenda and the meeting undertook to process of the elections. Three new members were required for a complete Board of Management. The vote for Service and Affiliate V. Presidents and the Public Officer positions, all formed elements of the election. We thank all nominees for their interest and know they will contribute at the Sub-Branch whenever they can.

Sincere thanks are extended to outgoing Board Members, for the massive contributions they have made over many years. We thank them in advance for their continued involvement in Sub-Branch matters and activities.

DVA: New Contact number 1800

This change is part of DVA's Veteran Centric Reform Program which includes improvements to our telephone channel to make it easier for veterans and their families to speak to the right person at the first point of contact.

You will start to see 1800 VETERAN (1800 838 372) rather than the previous general enquiry number 1800 555 254 in our publications and correspondence and on our website and other online portals. This is a gradual process and 1800 555 254 and 133 254 will remain active for some time yet until 1800 VETERAN (1800 838 372) is well embedded.

Some other external-facing numbers will remain for specific needs, including the transport bookings and Veteran Home Care.

Phone numbers for other non-DVA services will stay the same. For example, the current phone numbers for Open Arms and the Veterans' Review Board, will stay the same.
